  - a. What are the most significant experiences in your background that have shaped and demonstrated your commitment to serving the needs of Native Americans?
  - b. How will I best serve the needs of the Native American community in my future legal career?

(This essay carries the greatest weight in the evaluation of your application.)

2. Submit the following with your application:
  - a. An official copy of your most recent law school transcript (or for a first-year law student, a statement from your law school certifying that you are a law degree candidate enrolled at least part-time);
  - b. Resume;
  - c. Two (2) letters of recommendation (from persons not related to you); and
  - d. (Optional) a copy of your application to your law school for financial assistance.
3. If you do not submit the required information, your application will not be considered by the NNABA Foundation.
4. Your signature on this form must be notarized.
5. Submit this application and all required supporting materials electronically to [adminassistant@nativeamericanbar.org](mailto:adminassistant@nativeamericanbar.org) by **March 15, 2015**.



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### Notarized Signature

I, the undersigned applicant, understand that if I am awarded a NNABA Foundation Scholarship, I must be enrolled and in good standing at least half-time in an ABA- or AALS accredited law school in the United States at the time of award.
