Indigenous peoples around the world have diverse policy goals, rules, traditions, and customs for managing knowledge, creative expression, and innovation. Often those goals, customs, traditions, and rules are difficult to practice, preserve, and protect within the U.S. intellectual property systems. In this discussion we will explore this diversity and these legal challenges with experts representing the Native Hawaiian and Pueblo of Acoma people.
