POSITION: The Oregon Law Center (OLC) seeks a bilingual (Spanish/English) Paralegal, for a nine-month term (with the possibility of extension if funding allows), to support the provision of civil legal services to low-income clients. This position is based in Hillsboro, a city of 106,000 located about 45 minutes west of Portland, and serves clients throughout the northwest region of Oregon, including coastal, urban, and agricultural communities. From historic Astoria, Oregon's "Hollywood North," to the spectacular beaches of the north coast, wineries of the western Willamette Valley, international cuisine and minor-league baseball, this region of Oregon has a lot to offer.

ABOUT US: OLC is a legal services program committed to achieving justice for the low-income communities of Oregon by providing a full range of the highest quality civil legal services. OLC does not receive funding from the federal Legal Services Corporation. OLC operates eleven regional offices, a state support unit, legislative advocacy unit, and statewide farmworker program. OLC works closely with Legal Aid Services of Oregon and other partners in Oregon's coordinated civil legal services delivery system.

OLC's Hillsboro Regional Office consists of twelve attorneys, and 8 paralegals (including the advertised position). Office priorities are based on client need. Current priorities include housing, family, public benefits, employment, seniors, and immigrant rights. We seek to make real improvements in clients' lives and to help eliminate the underlying causes of poverty. The office has two satellite locations in St. Helens and McMinnville. The office serves clients living in Clatsop, Columbia, Tillamook, Washington, and Yamhill Counties.

RESPONSIBILITIES: The Paralegal's duties will include daily handling of multi-line phones, walkins, mail, and faxes; performing eligibility intake interviews; and entering data into the client database. The Paralegal will also provide assistance to clients with their connections to non-legal resources.
